REGULATION

ON THE SELECTION CRITERIA FOR STUDENT MOBILITY REGARDING PARTIAL STUDY ABROAD AND TRAINEESHIPS AND THE CALCULATION OF THE FINAL COMPETITIVE SCORE

17 September 2025, No. SP-54 Kaunas

In accordance with the Procedure for Organisation and Implementation of Student Mobility for Studies and Placement, I hereby a p p r o v e the selection criteria and the calculation of the final competitive score set forth for student mobility regarding partial study abroad and traineeships:

- 1. Academic results of the last two (2) semesters (average not lower than 7.5 for the last two (2) semesters) or academic results of a lower degree obtained (for second- and third-cycle first-year students)*.
- 2. The proficiency of the foreign language in which the studies or the traineeship are to be conducted.
- 3. The study or traineeship programme in question and conditions proposed by the host institution.
- 4. Student motivation to study abroad (motivation letter and interview with the Selection Committee).
- 5. Scientific, sport, social, and mentoring activities.
 - * First-year students of joint study programmes (International Master in Performance Analysis of Sport; International Basketball Coaching and Management) shall be required to submit their academic results (interim or final) from the foreign institution and a letter of recommendation from the foreign coordinator before Erasmus+student mobility and grant allocation.

Final competitive score calculation:

60% average of the overall academic performance +30% motivation +10% social involvement and self-sufficiency

The maximum score shall be 10, but additional points may be awarded for:

- **0.5** point participation in LSU's Erasmus+ mentoring activities for at least two (2) semesters.
- 0.3 point participation in Erasmus+ student mobility for the first time.
- 0.3 point participation in organising and preparing the social programme for Erasmus+ students.
